Texts for the Liturgical Service

Troparion (Tone 6)

The Angelic Powers were at Thy tomb; / the guards became as dead men. Mary stood by Thy grave, / seeking Thy most pure body. / Thou didst capture hell / not being tempted by it. / Thou didst come to the Virgin, granting life. // O Lord, Who didst rise from the dead, glory to Thee.

Troparion (Tone 1 – Feast of Theophany)

When Thou, O Lord, wast baptized in the Jordan, / the worship of the Trinity was made manifest. / For the voice of the Father bore witness to Thee, / and called Thee His beloved Son; / and the Spirit in the form of a <u>dove</u> / confirmed the <u>truth</u>fulness of His word. / O <u>Christ</u> our God, Who hast revealed Thyself // and hast enlightened the world, glory to Thee.

Troparion (Tone 2 – St John the Baptist)

The memory of the righteous is celebrated with songs of praise, / but the Lord's testimony is sufficient for thee, O Forerunner. / Thou wast shown indeed to be the most honorable of the Prophets, / for in the waters thou didst baptize Him Whom thou didst preach. / After suffering with joy on behalf of the truth, / thou didst proclaim even to those in hell the God Who appeared in the flesh, / Who takes away the sin of the world // and grants us great mercy!

Kontakion (Tone 6 – St John the Baptist)

The river Jordan trembled, and was driven back, / filled with fear at Thy coming in the flesh, / while John drew back in awe / as he fulfilled the ministry of the Spirit. / The ranks of Angels stood amazed / when they beheld Thee <u>baptized in the stream</u>. /

And we who were in darkness are filled with light. // We praise Thee, O God made manifest, as Thou dost enlighten all.

Kontakion (Tone 4 – Feast of Theophany)

Today Thou hast shone forth to the world, O Lord, / and the light of Thy countenance has been marked on us. / Knowing Thee, we sing Thy <u>prais</u>es: / Thou hast come and re<u>vealed</u> Thyself, // O unapproachable Light.

Prokeimenon (Tone 1 – Sunday after Theophany)

Let Thy mercy, O Lord, be upon us / as we have set our hope on Thee! v. Rejoice in the Lord, O ye righteous! Praise befits the upright!

Epistle Reading: Ephesians 4:7-13 (Sunday After Theophany)

But to each one of us grace was given according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore He says: "When He ascended on high, He led captivity captive, And gave gifts to men." (Now this, "He ascended" – what does it mean but that He also first descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is also the One who ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things.) And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ;

Alleluia (3x's) (Tone 5 – Sunday After Theophany)

- *v*. I will sing of Thy mercies, O Lord, forever; with my mouth I will proclaim Thy truth from generation to generation. Alleluia (3x's)
- *v*. For Thou hast said: Mercy will be established forever; Thy truth will be prepared in the heavens. Alleluia (3x's)

Gospel Reading: Matthew 4:12-17 (Sunday After Theophany)

The Now when Jesus heard that John had been put in prison, He departed to Galilee. And leaving Nazareth, He came and dwelt in Capernaum, which is by the sea, in the regions of Zebulun and Naphtali, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: The land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, By the way of the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles: The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, And upon those who sat in the region and shadow of death Light has dawned." From that time Jesus began to preach and to say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

[Instead of "It is truly meet.." we sing the Hymn to the Theotokos] Magnify, O my soul, the most-pure Virgin Theotokos, more honorable and more glorious than the heavenly hosts! No tongue is capable of praising you worthily; The angelic mind is overawed in exalting you, O Theotokos! But since thou art good, accept our faith, Since you are gracious and knowest our divine love, Thou art the defender of Christians, and we magnify thee!

Communion Hymn:

The grace of God hath appeared for the salvation of all men. The righteous shall be in everlasting remembrance. He shall not fear evil tidings. Alleluia (3x's)

St. Cedd of Lastingham [January 7th]

Saint Cedd was a missionary and bishop who spread the faith throughout England during the seventh century.

The eldest of four brothers, all of whom became priests, he was born in 620 AD into a noble Northumbrian family. At an early age, he began studies at the Lindisfarne Priory, where he became familiar with Irish monasticism. After pursuing further studies in Ireland, he was sent by Bishop Finan of Lindisfarne to evangelize

the people of Essex. He baptized many of th<mark>e loc</mark>als, built several churches, and founded monasteries in Bradwell-on-Sea and East Tilbury.

After his consecration to the episcopacy as Bishop of Essex, he reinstated Saint Paul's in London as the main seat of his diocese. He remained fond of his northern homeland and made regular visits there. On one such occasion in 658, he was approached by King Aethelwald of Deira who, finding Saint Cedd to be a good and wise man, pressed him to accept a parcel of land at Lastingham in Yorkshire on which to build a monastery. Saint Cedd eventually agreed, laying the foundation stones after the parcel had been cleansed through prayer and fasting. He became the first Abbot of Lastingham and remained so while still ministering to his flock in Essex.

Saint Cedd died in Lastingham during a great plague that also claimed the life of his brother Cynebil. Eventually, he was buried under the altar of a little stone church built at Lastingham in honor of the Mother of God. His relics were later transferred to the Litchfield Cathedral, which had been built by his brother Chad.

Saint Brannock of Braunton [January 7th]

Saint Brannock lived in the sixth century, and tutored the children of the Welsh ruler Brychan. He went with King Brychan on a pilgrimage to venerate the tombs of the Apostles. On the way home, he stopped in Brittany and remained there several years.

Eventually, the saint returned to Wales and settled at Braunton, where he built a church. His holy relics are said to rest beneath the altar of the Braunton church.
