Texts for the Liturgical Service

Troparion (Tone 8)

Thou didst descend from on high, O Merciful One! / Thou didst accept the three day burial / to free us from our sufferings! // O Lord, our Life and Resurrection, glory to Thee!

Troparion (Tone 4 – Conception of John the Baptist)

Rejoice, O barren one, who formerly didst not bear a child, / for thou hast conceived the Lamp of the Sun, Who is to illumine the whole universe darkened by blindness!
Rejoice, O Zachariah, / and cry out with boldness: // “The Prophet of the Most High desires to be born!”

Kontakion (Tone 8)

By rising from the tomb, Thou didst raise the dead and resurrected Adam. / Eve exults in Thy Resurrection, / and the world celebrates Thy rising from the dead, O greatly Merciful One!

Kontakion (Tone 1 – Conception of John the Baptist)

Great Zachariah rejoices with his wife, the far-famed Elizabeth, / for she has fittingly conceived John the Forerunner, / whom an Angel announced in gladness; and whom we rightly honor // as an initiate of the grace of God.

Prokeimenon (Tone 8)

Pray and make your vows / before the Lord our God!
v. In Judah God is known; His name is great in Israel.

Another Prokeimenon (Tone 7)

The righteous shall rejoice in the Lord and shall hope in Him.

Epistle Reading: 2 Corinthians 6:16-7:1

And what agreement has the temple of God with idols? For you are the temple of the living God. As God has said: “I will dwell in them And walk among them. I will be their God, And they shall be My people.” Therefore Come out from among them And be separate, says the Lord. Do not touch what is unclean, And I will receive you.” I will be a Father to you, And you shall be My sons and daughters, Says the LORD Almighty.” Therefore, having these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God.

Alleluia (3x's) (Tone 8)

- v. Come, let us rejoice in the Lord! Let us make a joyful noise to God our Savior! Alleluia (3x's)

Gospel Reading: Luke 5:1-11

So it was, as the multitude pressed about Him to hear the word of God, that He stood by the Lake of Gennesaret, and saw two boats standing by the lake; but the fishermen had gone from them and were washing their nets. Then He got into one of the boats, which was Simon's, and asked him to put out a little from the land. And He sat down and taught the multitudes from the boat. When He had stopped speaking, He said to Simon, "Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." But Simon answered and said to Him, "Master, we have toiled all night and caught nothing; nevertheless at Your word I will let down the net." And when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their net was breaking. So they signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. When Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord!" For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish which they had taken; and so also were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid. From now on you will catch men." So when they had brought their boats to land, they forsook all and followed Him.



Memory Eternal – Archpriest Vincent Saverino



On Thursday, September 20, following a long serious illness, one of the senior-most clerics of the Patriarchal Parishes in the USA and pastor emeritus of St. Michael the Archangel Church in Philadelphia, PA, Archpriest Vincent Saverino reposed in the Lord.

Fr. Vincent's pastoral service began in 1970 - the year in which the Patriarchal Parishes were established. For more than 30 years, he was a faithful servant to the various Administrators of the Patriarchal Parishes in the USA serving as a permanent member of the Bishop's Council. From 1976 to 2017 he served as rector of St. Michael the Archangel Church in Philadelphia, PA.

Fr. Vincent, along with our former parish priest, Father John Udics, were instrumental in the organizing and growing of the Philadelphia Orthodoxy Clergy Brotherhood.

The Administrator of the Patriarchal Parishes in the USA, Bishop John of Naro-Fominsk expressed his condolences to the relatives and spiritual children of the newly-reposed Archpriest Vincent. Bishop John instructed the dean of the Atlantic States, Archpriest John Vass and the rector of St. Michael Church, Priest Gregory Winsky to lead the organization all necessary arrangements regarding the funeral and burial of the departed.

The funeral and burial of the newly-reposed Archpriest Vincent will be held on September 25 in Philadelphia, PA.

Saturday, October 13 from 9AM to 3PM –Fall Outside Church and Hall Clean Up.



Conception of the Honorable Glorious Prophet, Forerunner and Baptist John [September 23rd]

The Conception of the Venerable Prophet, Forerunner and Baptist of the Lord, John: The holy Prophet Malachi prophesied that before the Messiah's birth His Forerunner would appear, and would indicate His coming. The Jews therefore in awaiting the Messiah also awaited the appearance of His Forerunner.

In a city of the hills of Judea in the land of Palestine lived the righteous priest Saint Zachariah and his wife Saint Elizabeth, zealously observing the commandments of the Lord. The couple, however, had a misfortune: they remained childless in their old age, and they prayed unceasingly to God to grant them a child.

Once, when Saint Zachariah took his turn as priest at the Temple of Jerusalem, he went into the Sanctuary to offer incense. Going behind the veil of the Sanctuary, he beheld an angel of God standing at the right side of the altar of incense.

Saint Zachariah was astonished and halted in fear, but the angel said to him, "Fear not, Zachariah, for your prayer is heard; and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John." But Zachariah did not believe the words of the heavenly messenger, and then the angel said to him, "I am Gabriel, who stand in the presence of God; and I was sent to speak to you, and to bring you the good news. Behold, you will be silent and unable to speak until the day that these things come to pass, because you did not believe my words "

Meanwhile, the people were waiting for Zachariah and they were astonished that he had not come out from the Sanctuary after so long a time. And when he did come out, he was supposed to pronounce a blessing upon the people, but could not do so because he had been struck speechless. When Zachariah explained by gestures that he was unable to speak, the people then understood that he had experienced a vision. The prophecy of the Archangel was fulfilled, and Righteous Elizabeth was delivered from her barrenness, and gave birth to John, the Forerunner and Baptist of the Lord.
